National Rice Program Hybrid Technology Demonstration/Model Farm (under the National Rice Program)	The hybrid technology/demonstration or model farm aims to showcase the benefits of using hybrid seeds and its production management. Target areas shall focus on fully irrigated areas. However, selected rain-fed areas with adequate water can also be included. Program areas shall be composed of contiguous farms or farm-clusters that can have a minimum area of 10 hectares. The recipients will be provided with hybrid seeds, fertilizers and zinc and/or soil farms or farm-clusters that can have a minimum area of 10 hectares.
