Please be informed of the following clarifications for the subject consulting services:

| Item | Clarification |
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| 1. Status of deployment and role of the Dutch Expert Team (DET) | <p>The DET has already been engaged in principle but there is still some flexibility depending on the winning local consultant.</p> <p>There will be no separate Terms of Reference (TOR) for the DET and the DET will work based on the TOR of the local consultants. As such, the scope of work of the DET cannot be detailed at this point. Nonetheless, the DET and local consulting team are expected to be deployed simultaneously and work as one team to attain the objectives and desired outputs under the TOR. Bulk of the work will be done locally with guidance and steering from the DET. The DET will clear all deliverables of the consultant under the study.</p> <p>The DET team leader will work full-time while other foreign experts will be part time (<i>please see attached indicative line up of DET personnel and corresponding indicative man-months of engagement</i>).</p> <p>Regarding the training-workshops, while the DET will provide some inputs, the local consultants will primarily be responsible for the conduct of said activity.</p> <p>On the other hand, while the DET will facilitate/organize the best practice visit/s, the cost of said activity will be part of the reimbursable expenses of the local consultants. The indicative budget to cover all costs attendant to said best practice visit/s is approximately Php2,000,000.00. Please</p> |

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| | <p>note that the said budget for best practice visit/s is already covered under the total budget for reimbursable expenses (i.e., not additional/incremental) as indicated in the breakdown of the Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) in the TOR.</p> |
| <p>2. Change/replacement of experts and/or inclusion of additional or new positions/personnel</p> | <p>In the submission of technical and financial proposals, consultants may replace personnel initially nominated for the eligibility check and shortlisting process.</p> <p>A new position (e.g., oceanographer or [ocean] current specialist, among others) that is not indicated in the TOR may be proposed by the consultant based on its appreciation of the scope and nature of work, and should be in line with its proposed plan of approach or methodology (<i>please note that the attached DET indicative positions include, among others, a hydrodynamic modeler</i>).</p> <p>Unnamed provisional positions shall not be allowed/accepted.</p> <p>Please note that all CVs of nominated experts under the Technical Proposal should be notarized. In lieu of a notarization, foreign personnel presently in other countries should have their CVs verified and acknowledged by the Philippine Embassy or Consular Office in the country where the foreign expert is currently based. On the other hand, foreign personnel currently in the Philippines should have their CVs notarized.</p> <p>Each nominated expert under the Technical Proposal should also confirm that the content of his/her CV is correct and the experts themselves should sign the certification of the CV. In addition, the expert should submit a signed written commitment stating that the expert shall work for the Project once awarded the contract.</p> |
| <p>3. Duration of the study</p> | <p>The study will essentially be divided into strategic and operational phases. The expected duration of the study may change during the inception phase.</p> |
| <p>4. Professional services under reimbursable expenses</p> | <p>Reimbursable expenses include all costs attendant or incidental to the conduct of the scope of work of the study</p> |

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| | <p>towards the achievement of the desired outputs and objectives under the TOR. In this regard, although the said professional services are not expected to be done by the assigned experts themselves (i.e., not part of their remuneration), these are nevertheless expected to be part of the activities under the scope of work of the consultant, which it may outsource to third party providers.</p> |
| <p>5. Scoping mission report / Bathymetric survey</p> | <p>The Scoping Mission Report on Master Planning for the Manila Bay Area prepared by the Dutch Risk Reduction (DRR) Team, which local consultants may use as reference is available online at: http://www.drrteam-dsswater.nl/wp-content/uploads/2015/06/Manila_Bay_mission_report_January2016_final.pdf.</p> <p>However, the bathymetric survey of the Manila Bay, which is spearheaded by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) and National Mapping and Resource Information Authority (NAMRIA), is currently ongoing.</p> <p>All other pertinent documents that are in possession of NEDA and other National Government Agencies but are not readily accessible through the internet may be made available to the Consultant subject to the signing of a Confidentiality and Non-Disclosure Agreement (CNDA).</p> <p>Nonetheless, please note that the local consultant's scope of works under the TOR involves the conduct of inclusive assessment, identification of potential stakeholders and primary data gathering (including interviews/coordination with relevant individuals, agencies, institutions, among others, and may not necessitate updating of data that continue to remain valid).</p> |
| <p>6. Schedule of Remuneration payments</p> | <p>The Consultant is allowed to propose a different payment schedule for remuneration in line with its plan of approach or methodology subject to the evaluation and approval of NEDA.</p> <p>All payments for remuneration shall be subject to acceptance by NEDA of the quality of deliverables/outputs.</p> |

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| 7. Additional reminders | Consultants should ensure that the actual man-months of related experience of their nominated personnel are clearly specified in their submissions. Consultants should also ensure that documents needing notarization are done so in the proper form and manner. |
