The project will also assess possible technologies that may be adopted to address PBDE management. The project will also subsidize the disposal of PCBs from rural cooperatives and to further enhance the suitability of the existing facility to treat all PCB-contaminated materials including solids and metallic parts. Transformer replacement program will be financed through a loan package from DBP. Overall, the project is expected to achieve effective management of POPs-PBDE from WEEE, and PCB wastes and PCB-contaminated equipment assisting the Philippines to meet its obligation to the Stockholm Convention.
